- 1. Cover sheet stating your name and year in school
- 2. A 2-3 page essay addressing
 - why you wish to attend the conference;
 - what you can bring to it (for example, relevant coursework, volunteer or paid work
 experience, histories of race justice-related activism, research questions if on field
 study; or, in contrast, the gap in your learning that makes this an important meeting for
 you to attend);
 - what specific parts of the conference program you're especially interested in, and why (find the program on: https://facingrace.raceforward.org/); and
 - what you hope to gain from it, including how you expect to use what you learn at the
 conference in your field study, field study research, or –more relevant to pre-FS
 students—in shaping your work in the major.
- 3. A statement of commitment to complete a short essay (250-500 words) about your conference experience by December 1, 2016 that we can post on the Community Studies website and Facebook page, and –provided you're on campus in spring 2017—to facilitating a skills workshop as part of CMMU 102.
